This is my first issue since becoming the Editor, due to my bypass surgery I was in no condition to undertake the task of editing BS15B and I must thank Norman Batho for again filling the breach.

Of course I've set myself a hard task; how can one hope to achieve the success of previous editors! On this note, perhaps one of our oldest members might like to put pen to paper and write a history of the "Club".

I have in my possession all ten issues of the "Spoken Word"; the first was issued in August 1980 and we then called ourselves "The Bicycle-on-Stamps Study Unit". We didn't refer to our publication as a "magazine" - we called it what it really is: the Club Newsletter.

The first editor was Frank Havnoonian, who was apparently talked into producing the Newsletter by Dr. Jim Palmieri. The second issue had a list of members; there were 19 and 2 of those original members are still members: I refer to Gary Nooger and David Sher.

Issue No: 9 - Summer 1985 - saw Douglas Marchant taking over as Editor; Frank had found it increasingly difficult to continue to compile and issue the Newsletter. Summer 1986 saw the first issue of "Bicycle Stamps" and the Bicycle Stamps Club was formed, with Douglas as Editor. In his editorial, Douglas said "the previous Club - The Bikes-on-Stamps Study Unit - failed owing to lack of support given to Frank Havnoonian, the Founder and Editor of that Club's magazine 'The Spoken Word'". Nothing much has changed - the Newsletter, Magazine, call it what you will, only survives on YOUR INPUT!

Douglas remained as Editor until Issue No: 8 - Spring 1990 - when Norman Batho was elected, following our first-ever elections. Norman introduced the concept of 4 Issues per year and completed two terms (4 years) as Editor and, although Issue BS15B has my name as Editor, Norman in fact did all the work!

I look forward to receiving your contributions for the next issue and, in the meantime, keep those wheels spinning and enjoy your collecting...

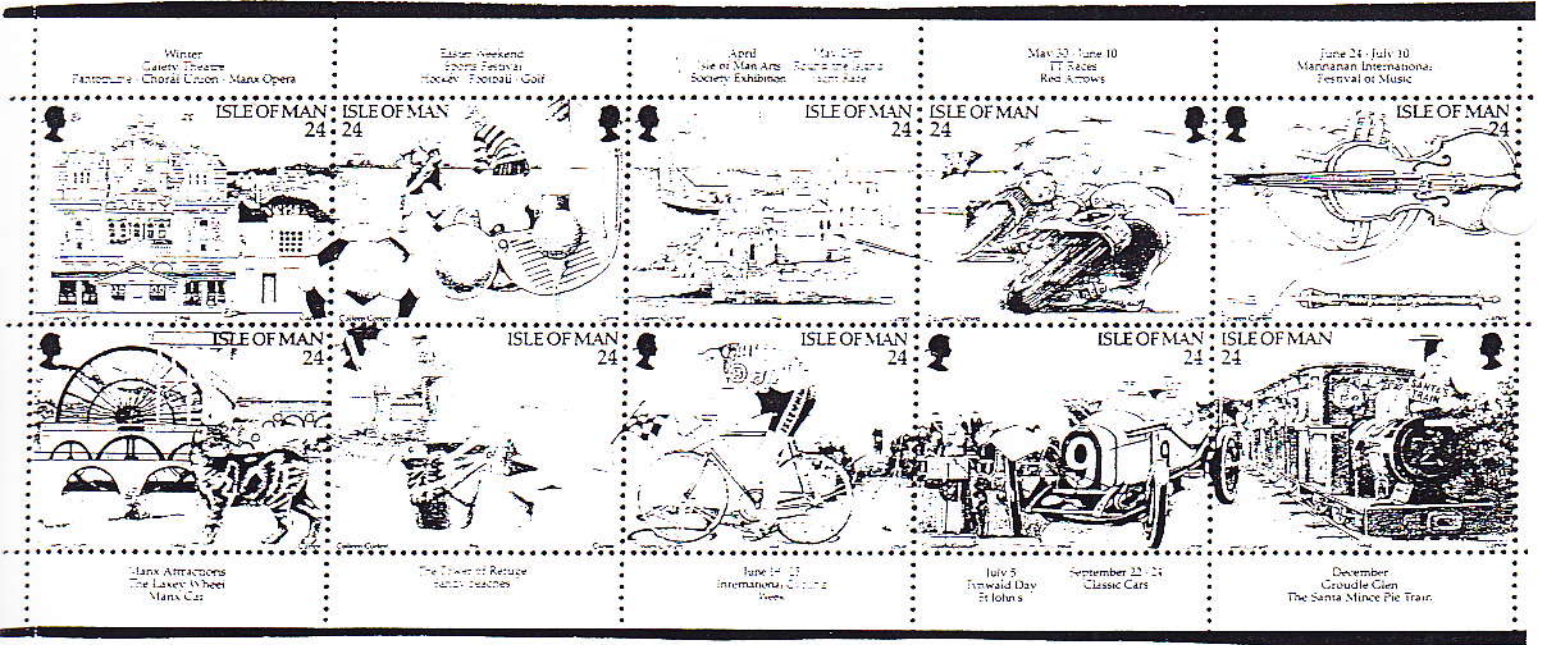
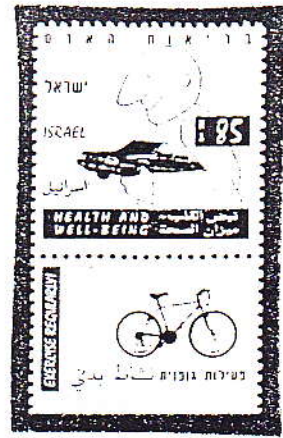

THE EARLY GERMAN ZUSAMMENDRUCKE

Many countries have issued postal stamps with labels attached. Probably the earliest se-tenent bicycle related labels were those issued by the German State of Bayern in 1912 and the Deutsches Reich in 1911.

BAYERN

The Spf green *Michel* #77 type I and type II (Scott #78), differing from each other primarily in the printed "R" and "E" in the inscription "12 MAERZ 1911" appearing at the top of each stamp, were printed in sheets, for use in booklets. They were printed with forty-seven different and three duplicate labels attached, perf and imperf, in the same combination of greens as used for the stamp. Only three of these are of cycling interest, *Michel* numbers R. 20, Limania Berlin; R. 43, Heinrich Delmuth; and R. 44, Lyra Fahrrader. *Scott* makes no attempt to differentiate the labels.

The fifty different Spf stamp/label combinations, including the three labels in which we are interested, were printed in sheets of 10 x 10 as pictured below.

"R" = label, "Z" = spacer, and "5" = stamp value

The sheets of 5pf stamps with their labels were cut into two row strips which were then separated into three panes containing two labels and four 5pf stamps. The spacer row provided means of attaching the interior pane to the booklet cover.

Additionally, the 10pf red *Michel* #78 type I and type II (Scott #79), were printed with ten different labels attached - both perf and imperf, printed, in approximately the format as the 5pf above, but with a stamp in every other row replacing a label, in the same combination of reds as used for the stamp. None of these labels are of direct cycling interest, but because they eventually became part of the booklets in which the "bicycle" labels were issued, I mention them here.

The sheets of 10pf stamps with their labels were cut into two row strips which were then separated into three panes containing one label and five 10pf stamps as follows.

Altogether thirty-five different panes were created by this process.

There were:

- ten panes composed of 1 label and 5 x 10pf = 50pf
- twenty-five panes composed of 2 labels and 4 x 5pf = 20pf

Booklets with two different covers were issued, "A," and "B." Only "A" is of interest here. It contained two different panes of the red 10pf stamps with their labels and five different panes of the green 5pf stamps with their labels. Simple arithmetic tells us the nominal value of the stamps in every booklet was 2. marks.



Michel numbers the booklets MH 1a, MH 1b, MH 1c, MH 1d, and MH 1e. Only two of these booklets are of interest to us. MH 1c, 135,000 copies of which were issued April 1912, contains label R. 20 and it is on the third pane in the booklet underneath R. 11. MH 1e, of which 120,000 copies were issued October 1912, contains label R. 43 and it is on the sixth pane underneath R. 42, and R. 44 is on the seventh pane above R. 45.

For any one interested in exactly which stamp, 77 type I or 77 type II, is attached to which bicycle label - MH 1c, contains the 10pf type I and the 5pf type II. MH 1e contains type II of both values.

Some of the fifty-plus labels were used in other combinations and with other stamps, however R. 20, R. 43, and R. 44 were not, and so may only be found in the combinations indicated above.

DEUTSCHES REICH

Here a similar scheme was implemented to allow advertising labels to be printed se-tenant with postal stamps beginning in 1910 and continuing through 1945. Initially the stamps chosen were the 1905 5pf green Germania, Michel #85 and 10pf red #86 (Scott #82-3). They were printed with sixteen different and eight duplicate labels attached, perf and imperf, in the same combination of greens as used for the stamp. Only three of these are of cycling interest, *Michel* numbers R. 14, H. Burgsmueller; R. 20, Stukenbrok Einbeck; and R. 25, Versandhaus Limania. *Scott* makes no attempt to differentiate the labels.

The twenty-four different 5pf stamp/label combinations, including the three labels in which we are interested, and twelve 10pf stamp/label combinations were printed in sheets of 10 x 10 similar to that pictured for Bayern. The sheets, when cut into panes produced

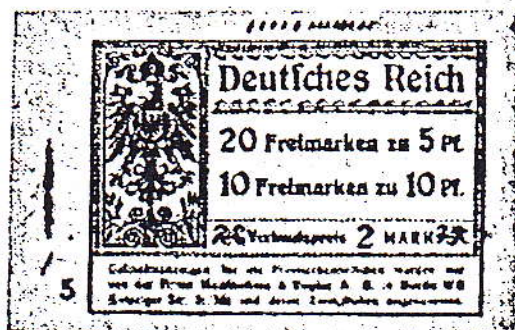

Altogether thirty-six different panes were created by this process.

There were:

- twenty-four panes composed of 1 label and 5 x 5pf = 25pf
- twelve panes composed of 1 label and 5 x 10pf = 50pf



Deutsches Reich Booklet MH 3 was issued with six different combinations of four different panes of the green 5pf stamps with their labels and two different panes of the red 10pf stamps with their labels. Simple arithmetic tells us the nominal value of the stamps in every booklet was 2. marks.

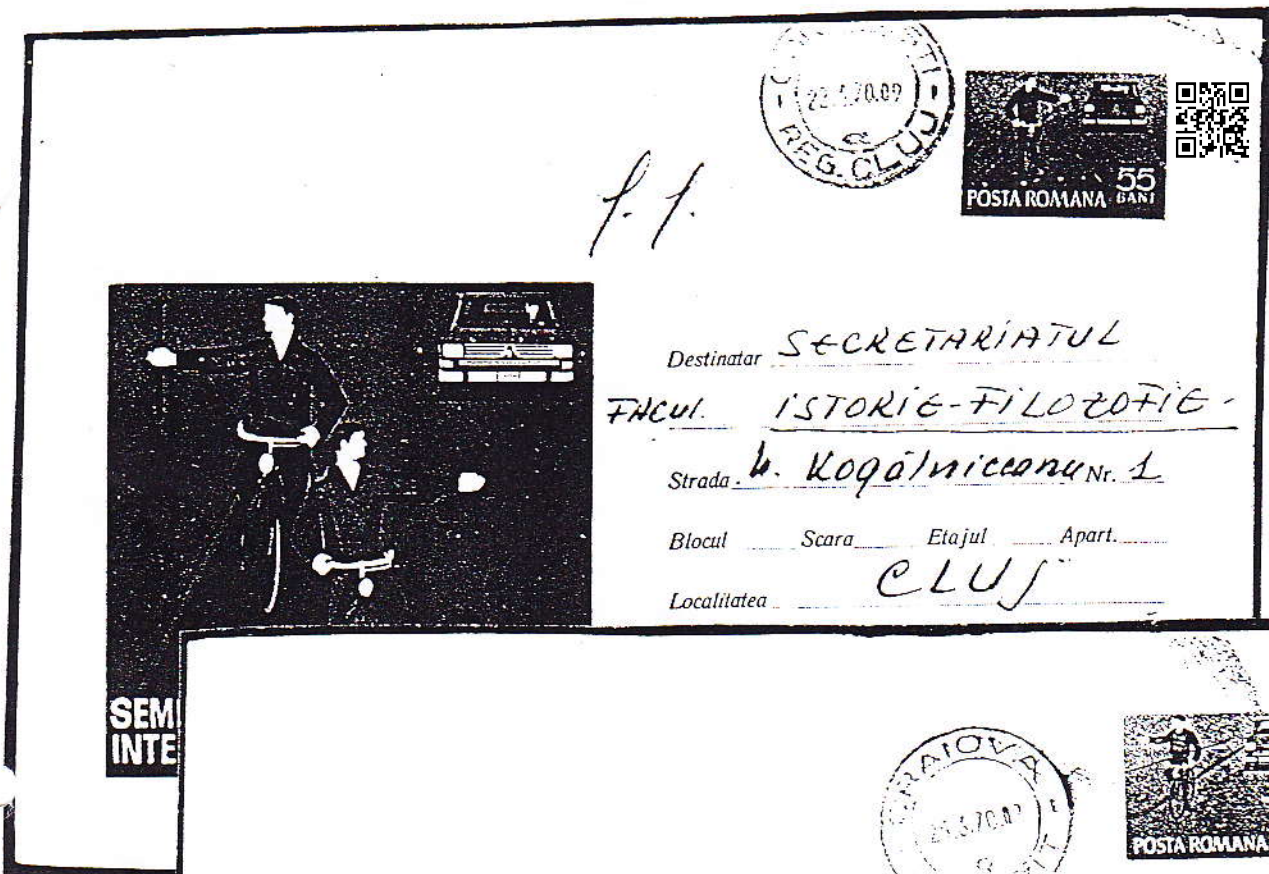
Michel numbers the booklets MH 3 ONr. 4, 4A, 5, 6A, 8, and 10. Only three of these booklets are of interest to us. 4A, which was issued in 1911, contains label R. 20 and it is on the fifth pane in the booklet. 6A, which was issued in 1911, contains label R. 14 and it is on the fourth pane, and 8, which was issued in 1911, contains label R. 25 and it is on the fifth pane.

Not all of the sheets printed for either Bayern nor the Deutsches Reich were used in booklets. Unusual horizontal and vertical combinations of stamps, labels, and spacers can be found, created from these sheets.

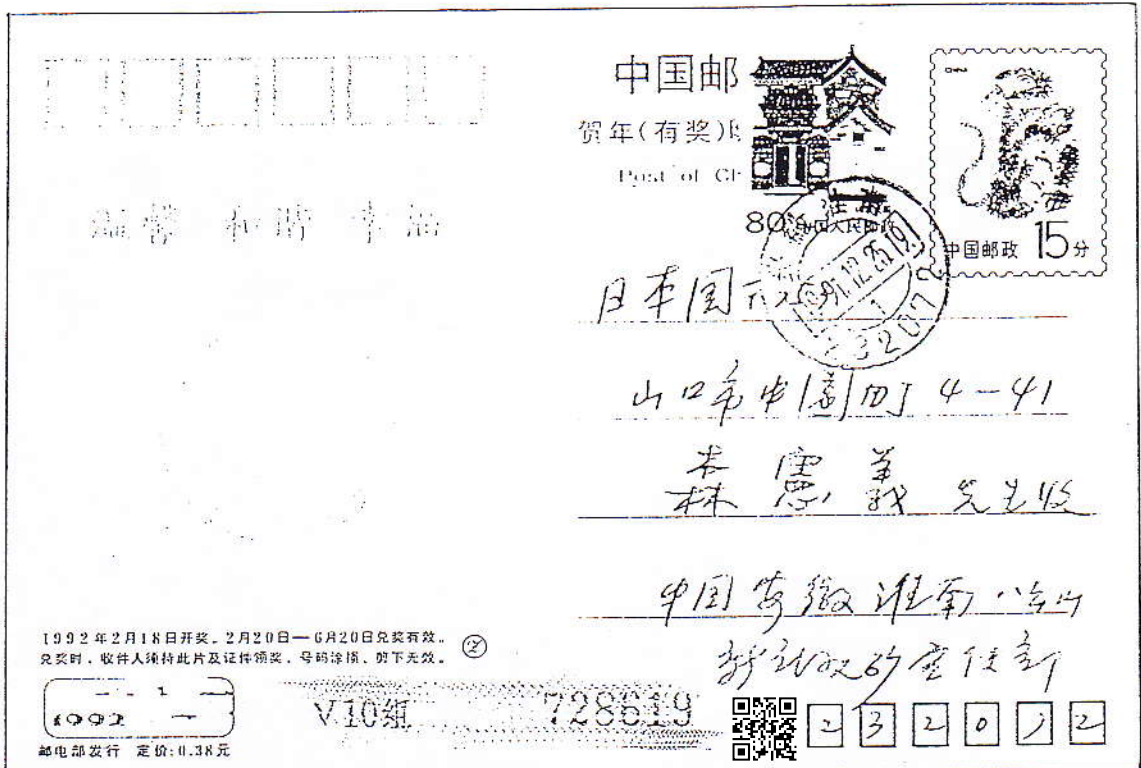

For some years the residents of the Swiss town of Basel have been using PTT-RAPID, the courier service of the PTT that delivers by car.

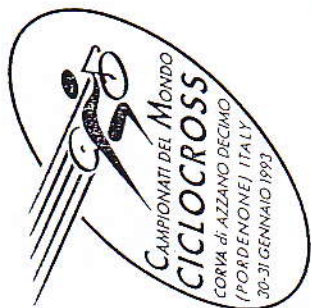
Recent research on the speed of delivery revealed that PTT-RAPID was not the fastest method; they were placed second in the survey, the Company that took first place made use of bicycles.

The success of this bicycle service prompted the Swiss PTT to start operating a similar service (FAHRRADKURIER). At the moment the PTT-FAHRRADKURIER consists of one employee who delivers express letters in the town of Basel. If this trial is successful and the costs will not exceed the profits, more cyclists will be employed.
