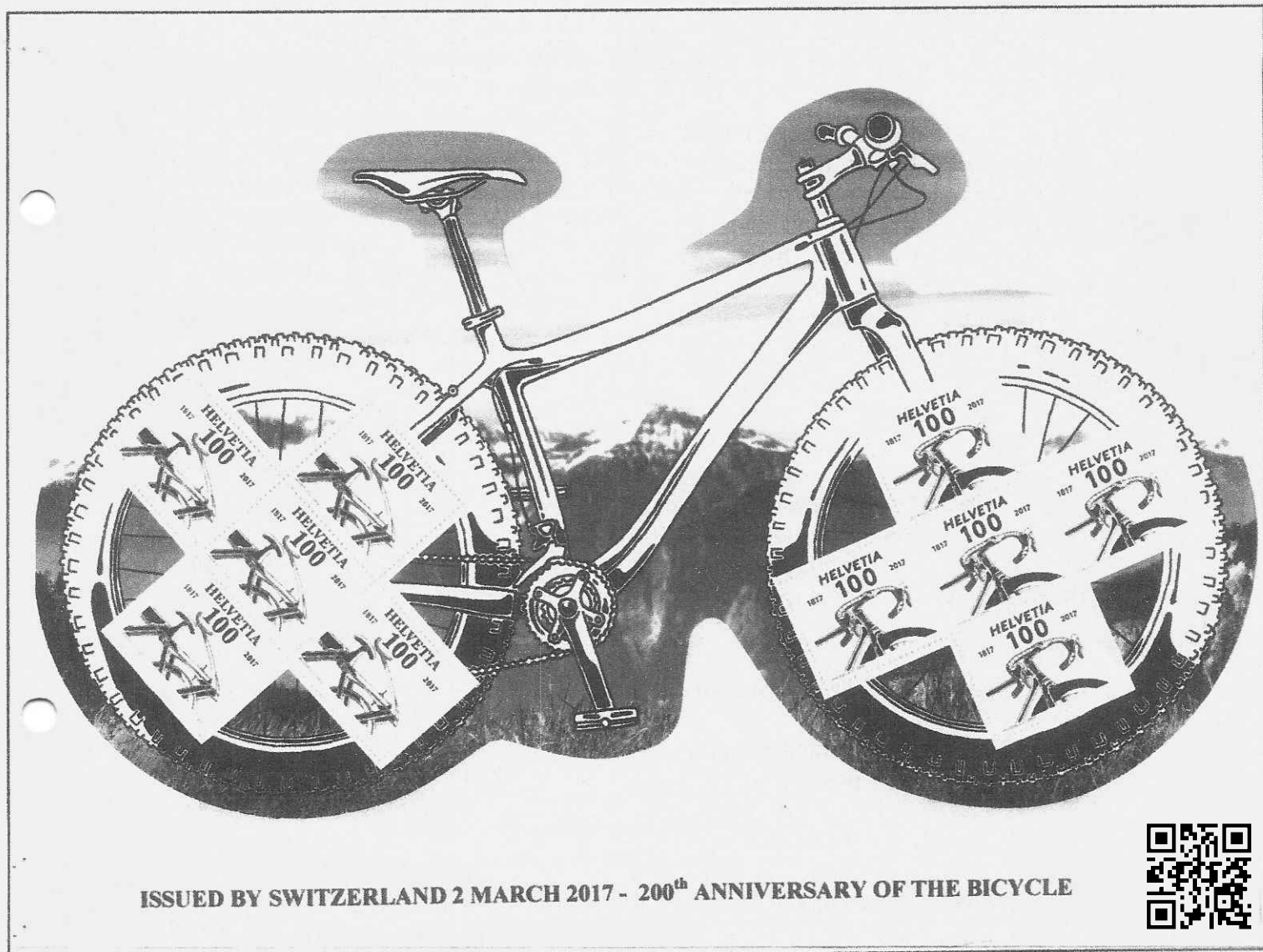

Editorial

Welcome to the 83rd issue of *Bicycle Stamps* and a special welcome to our newest member, John Myerscough of Fife in Scotland. John is retiring shortly and has decided that collecting bicycles on stamps will be a relaxing hobby.

Steve Andreasen has managed to close down the out of date website which we have been unable to update since Tony Teidman, our previous Secretary and Editor died. Steve considers we should set up a new website as soon as possible. However, like me, he does not have the technical competence to do it himself. Please read his report on page 17 and I hope that somebody will come forward to take on this important task.

Thomas Matthies has once again providing us with the "New Issues" section. He has also pointed out that illegal Europa "Green theme" stamps, many incorporating a bicycle, are in circulation, some under names of Scottish islands. The Isle of Man has reported to the Universal Postal Union (UPU) that stamps are circulating in its name, without authority. It is a criminal offence to circulate illegal stamps. Interestingly, Arnoldt Rehm has enquired about bicycle issues from Togo and Redonda, which do not appear in Stanley Gibbons catalogues. It is important that we are made aware of these fake "stamps" but collectors should make their own minds up whether or not to collect them.

I am repeating details of the Bicycle Stamp Exhibition in Luxembourg on 21st and 22nd October 2017 organised by our own Ralph Letsch. An entry form is on page 35 and I hope that a few BSC members will be prepared to take part. 30 June 2017 is the closing date.

Please check the Club Roster and if there is an asterisk (*) or double asterisk (**) against your name, I do hope you will send the subscription to Steve Andreasen or me, promptly.


I welcome comments about *Bicycle Stamps*. Would you prefer 4 issues per year, but with fewer pages per issue? We publish New Issues lists but would you like to see lists of bicycle slogans or special handstamps? Illustrations of Poster stamps and illustrated envelopes are included in this issue. Would you like to see more, or less?

NEW INTERNET PRESENCE FOR THE BICYCLE STAMPS CLUB?

The Bicycle Stamp Club (the "Club") deserves a new presence on the Internet. What form should it take?

The prior website for the Club had been created about a decade ago by a member who is since deceased. The site was set up in a way it could not conveniently be modified. There had, however, been no ongoing cost to the Club. The site, last updated in 2009, was completely out of date and was taken off the internet in early 2017.

Now, the more important issue is what form of website or other presence on the internet does the Club want - to let the world know of our existence and for the use of our members?

At a minimum, I think we should have some form of site to act at as a "brochure" providing interested individuals with contact information for officers of the Club, an indication of the amount of the dues, and a description of the benefits of membership.

Beyond that, would the members want to create a mechanism via email for one member to contact the other members, in a secure, convenient fashion? Would the members want a "marketplace" to use among themselves to buy or sell philatelic material of interest? Do the Club members want to create a Club list of bicycle stamp resources? What other features would the members like to see in a new website or other Internet presence?

I do not have the technical expertise (or inclination) to create or direct the creation of a new website or other presence on the Internet. There may be other members who have or are willing to acquire this expertise for the benefit of the Club. Are there volunteers out there?

There are many different approaches that might be taken to the issue - from a traditional website to something simpler such as a Google mail group or a social media site. In deciding on an approach cost, of course, is a consideration. The Club funds are rather meager.

I would be glad to receive and summarize responses from members to begin a conversation regarding what type of website or internet presence we want. Let me hear from you! I will report back to the members.

Isle of Man – Illegal stamp issues

Dear Sir/Madam,

The designated operator of the ISLE OF MAN, Isle of Man Post Office, asks me to inform the designated operators of UPU member countries of the following:

"Isle of Man Post Office has recently discovered that the series shown in Annex 1 are being sold and distributed as stamps produced by the Isle of Man. Isle of Man Post Office confirms that these are illegal issues and are not valid as evidence of the payment of postage. Isle of Man Post Office strongly denounces and condemns the designing, printing and selling of such illegal stamp issues. This regrettable activity has potential to cause damage to the reputation of, and economic harm to, the Isle of Man. Isle of Man Post Office will be producing a Europa 2016 issue, but this will not be officially on sale until 12 August 2016.

"Consequently, Isle of Man Post Office is calling upon the cooperation, solidarity and support of all member countries of the Universal Postal Union and its bodies to prohibit the sale and circulation of the illegal stamps, in accordance with their own laws and regulations, as well as the provisions of the Universal Postal Convention, and to help the Isle of Man to take all necessary and appropriate measures to bring the producers of the illegal stamps to justice. The continued production and sale of illegal issues is a criminal activity, which is not only harming philately and the reputation of the territory concerned, but is detrimental to all countries and territories and the wider postal sector."

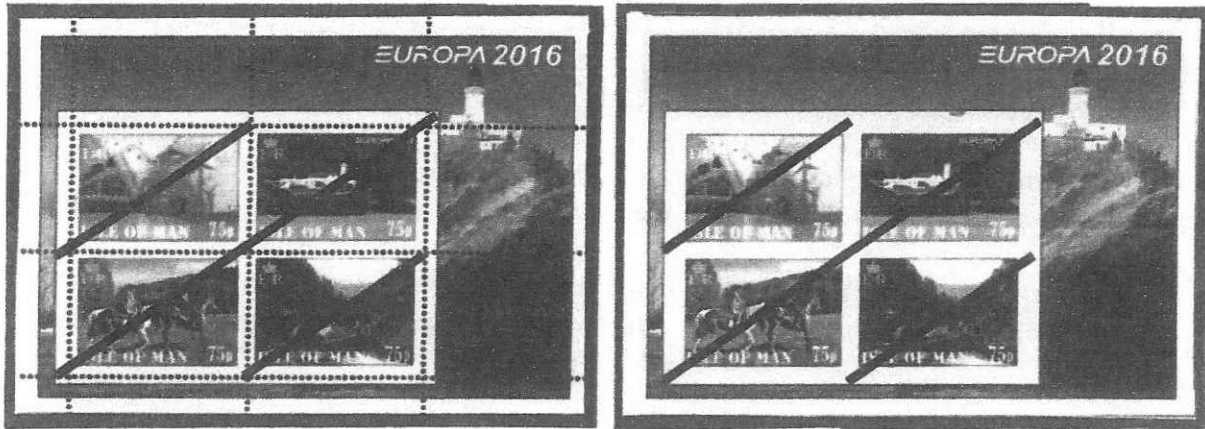

STAMPS NOT LISTED IN STANLEY GIBBONS' CATALOGUES

Arnoldt Rehm emailed me recently to check whether a stamp from Togo shown on page 35 in BS 74 was listed in Stanley Gibbons catalogue. He advised me that it appeared in the *Michel* catalogue as no. 438 (sheetlet 673) issued 28 December 2011 (months after the event)

On checking Stanley Gibbons' *Stamps of the World 2017*; the listing of stamps for Togo, with catalogue numbers, ceased at 1989, with a note underneath:-

"The following stamps have either been issued in excess of postal needs or have not been available to the public in reasonable quantities at face value. Such stamps may later be given full listing if there is evidence of regular postal use. All embossed on gold foil."

A long list of subjects followed (all thematic) from 1989 to 2010 (30 entries for 2010) I suggested that the item in question and the other "pretty" cycle history miniature sheets shown in BS74 would also become "appendix" items in, in due course.



Arnoldt later enquired whether Stanley Gibbons listed "Redonda" and included a scan of a Redonda \$5 stamp showing John E duPont "Father of Triathlon in The Americas".

He had referred to *Linn's* who had published a straightforward comment on Redonda (1979-91):-

"Stamp-issuing status, inactive: population, 0. A steep guano-covered rock one-half mile square in the eastern Caribbean between Montserrat and Nevis, owned by Antigua. Antiguan stamps overprinted "REDONDA" were introduced in 1979 with purpose-designed issues on a variety of popular topics following later that year. These were postally valid on Antigua, since Redonda has neither postal service nor inhabitants".

I checked Redonda in *SG Stamps of the World*. There was an entry but with a note:- "A dependency of Antigua. The following stamps were issued in anticipation of commercial and tourist development; philatelic mail being handled in Antigua.

"Since at the present time the island is uninhabited we do not list or stock these items. It is understood that the stamps are valid for the prepayment of postage in Antigua."

Underneath there was a list of stamps (without catalogue numbers) for each year from 1979 to 1991, which excluded miniature sheets and imperforate stamps etc.

Arnoldt had also referred to the Universal Postal Union's site, where there is a section on the World Numbering System (WNS).

The World Association for the Development of Philately (WADP) and the Universal Postal Union (UPU) had jointly conceived and developed the WADP Numbering System – WNS, which was launched on 1 January 2002.

When searching for a list of Togo stamps with a WNS number the site recorded "The 2011 issuing programme is not available".

The WNS system by the UPU was intended to defeat the issue of these bogus issues but not all countries have signed up and the numbers, as far as I am aware, are notified long after the stamps are on sale.

Arnoldt responded that he had not seen a single genuine letter from Redonda, but that there were 350 entries for Redonda in the *Michel* catalogue. He had the impression that *Michel* was involved with printers like "stamperija".

The *Scott* catalogue does not list any Redonda stamps and Arnoldt commented. "It seems to me as if there is a cooperation between Michel and the printer/agent "stamperija":

The one prints wallpapers and the other one catalogs - a win-win situation for both. Only the collector gets poorer and poorer. I have the suspicion, that "stamperija" even creates the Michel numbers. I mean, that I have seen Mi-numbers on the stamperija homepage before they were listed in the Michel-Online-Catalog! – I am not sure but I will keep an eye on this".

He then raised the question "Are these stamps worth collecting and do they belong in the 'New Issues Update'?" and continued "In any case - I have decided not to collect this stuff anymore - and I really feel good with this decision. Thomas Matthies wrote an article a few years ago in the BS Magazine with the same content. I think it would be good, when president and editor of our club take a clear position in this matter - as a support for all members. My own decision prevented me from losing the fun of collecting bicycle stamps."

Unfortunately the number of letters sent by post is decreasing year by year as electronic methods of sending messages take over. I agree with the practice by both the Editors of Stanley Gibbons' and Scott catalogues who apply a criteria of only listing stamps on sale at post offices to the public in reasonable quantities at face value. However, I am reluctant to lay down rules for what others should collect. It's bad enough struggling with the Rules and Regulations of the F.I.P., if entering a Thematic Philately National or International Exhibition, without stipulating what collectors should and should not collect.

I am happy that Arnoldt has taken a firm stance but I feel that other members of the BSC should decide for themselves how to extend their bicycle stamp collections. Have other members any views on this?

I am very happy that Thomas Matthies provides such comprehensive "New Issues" pages in every issue of *Bicycle Stamps* but it would be unfair to expect him to assess every entry and to include only "genuine" stamps, issued by Postal authorities, on sale at post office counters in the actual country named on the stamp. 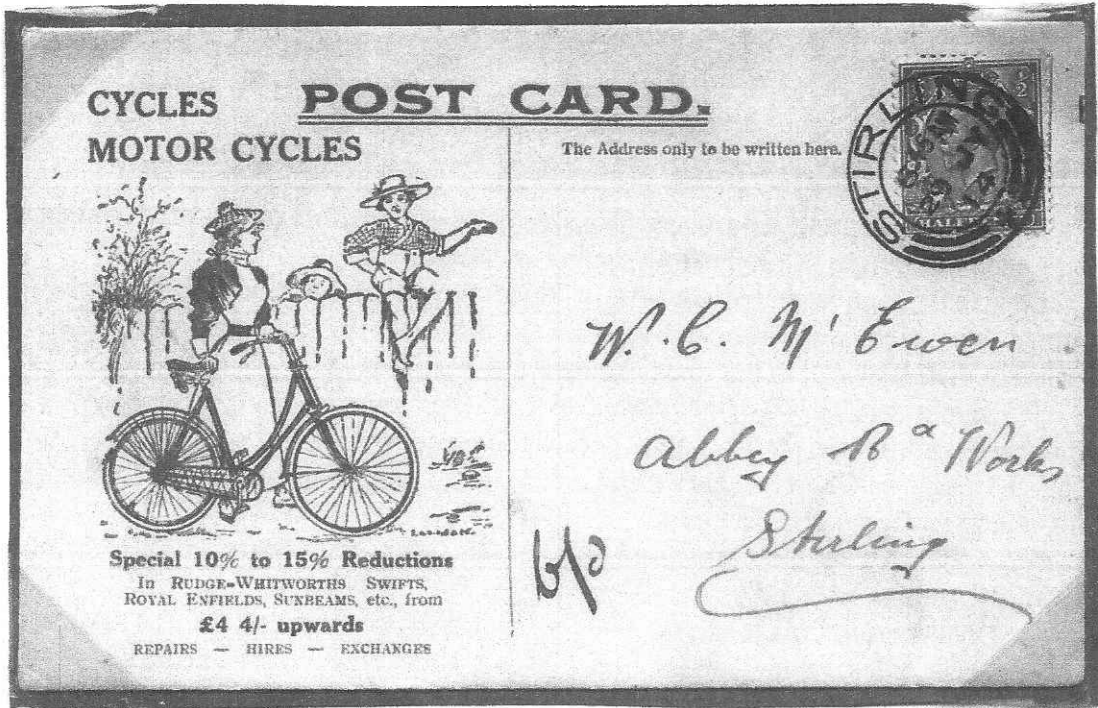

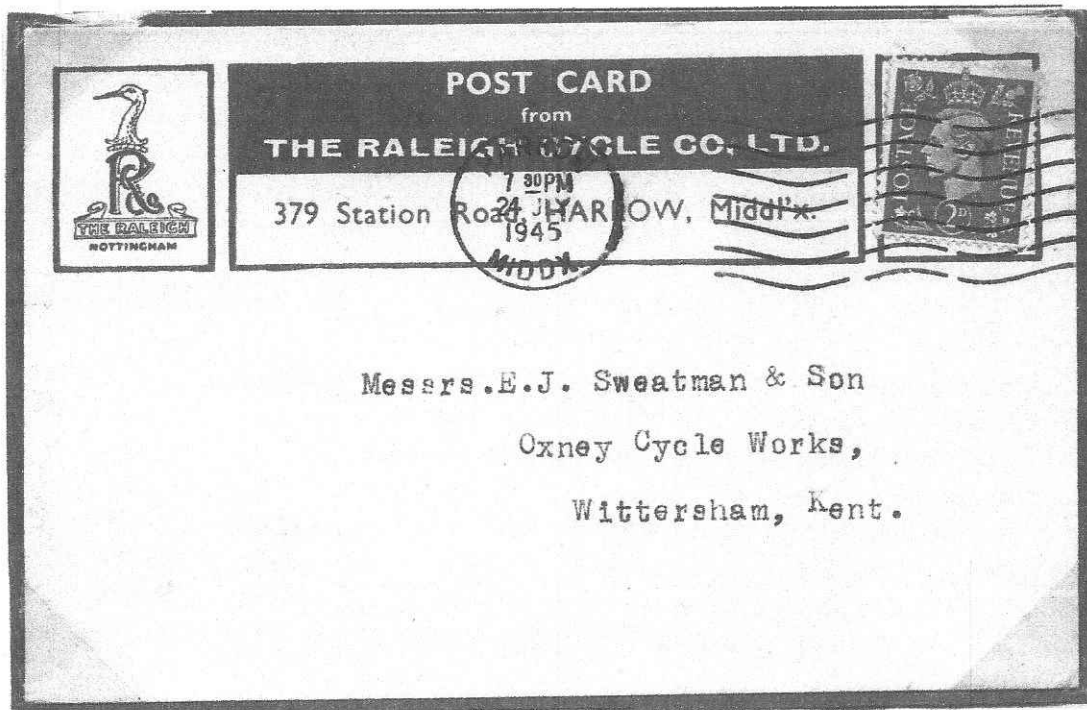

EXTRACT from *Cinderellas Australasia* Vol 18 No2 August 2002 (No 51)

The following is an article reproduced from *The Australian Philatelist* dated January 25 1897 and is therefore "straight from the horses mouth"

Mr Healy has favoured us with a brief sketch of his Cycle Express, the operations of which were brought to a close last year by the extension of the Government mail services to the routes he formally maintained.

The cycle service was first started in 1893, leaving Coolgardie for Southern Cross (120 miles) before the telegraph line was opened, conveying special messages at a charge of £25 each, and also carrying a few letters at various charges. The record trip was made by Bamlett in 12 hours.

No adhesive stamps were used during this year, the letters prepaid being handstamped with word 'paid'.

In 1894 regular cycle mails were despatched to Widgiemula (51 miles), Norseman (120 miles), and Dundas (140 miles). Both letters and telegrams were carried at charges varying from 6d to 5s. The through record trip was again made by Bamlett, who, with fully 80lbs weight of mail matter on his bicycle, accomplished the distance in 12 hours.

In April, 1895, a regular cycle mail was despatched to Menzies 110 miles, and the service was afterwards extended to Niagara, 135 miles, the charges being 2s 6d and 5s.

When the Lake Darlot rush started, Hamblin, the champion mail cyclist was despatched. The distance was 280 miles, and for some months the service proved the most remunerative of all, over £50 per trip being received. The record trip occupied three days, and, taking into consideration the state of the track, this was phenomenal. On this trip Hamblin put up a record for Menzies, covering the 110 miles in 10 ½ hours. Letters were carried at 2s, 2s 6d, and 5s. It afterwards became necessary to employ a camel for this service, owing to the weight of the mails, Crump, formerly cyclist, riding the camel.

In 1894 the stamps described in the *Australian Philatelist* for May last, were issued for prepaying letters and other mail matter.

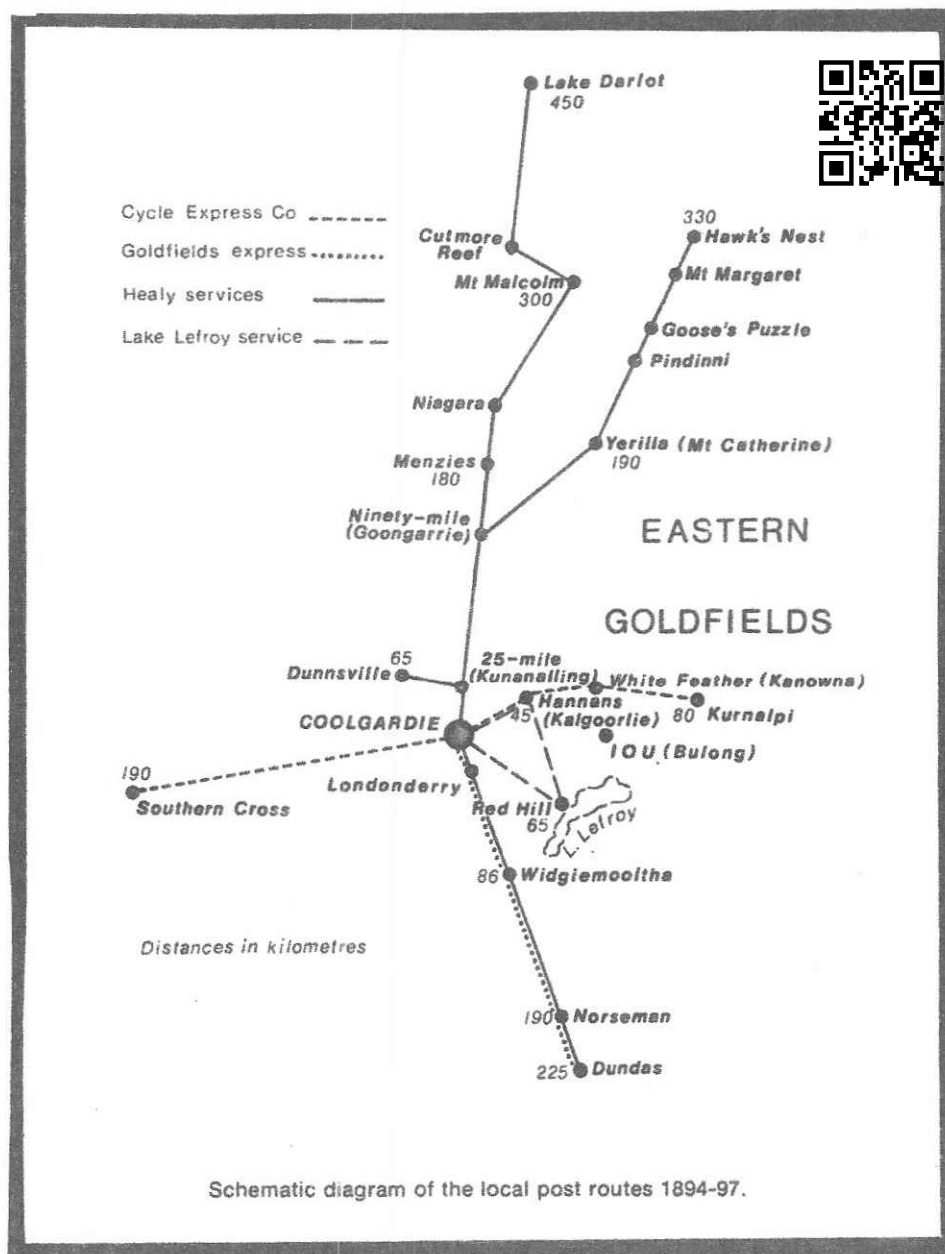
In June 1895, a regular cycle mail was despatched to Mount Margaret, Yerilla, Goose's Puzzle etc., the through distance being 200 miles.

The Hannan's mail was started in October 1895, during the boom. Several of the leading brokers, who were dissatisfied at the delay in the transmission of Government telegrams, suggested that the service should be opened, and the results justified the enterprise, several instances of cyclists beating the telegrams have occurred. A charge of 2s 6d. each was made for messages, or a weekly subscription of 10s 6d. The distance is 28 miles, and Beveridge the cyclist, has covered it in an hour and a half.

As early as June, 1895, the first supply of stamps was running short, and a new series was ordered consisting of three values, 6d., 2s., and 5s.

Owing to vexatious delays these stamps did not arrive till June 1896. By this time nearly all the routes formerly served by Healy's express were taken over by the Government, only the Mount Margaret and Northern localities remaining open to the camel and cycle expresses. These were principally kept going by subsidies received from mining companies having big interests in the districts. Letters were charged 1s, 1s 6d., 2s. 6d., and 5s. The last route was finally closed to Mr Healy's operations in December 1896.

The 1896 series of stamps are very attractive in design. They are oblong rectangles, with a picture of a camel and rider crossing the desert, with the setting sun just sinking below the horizon. This vignetter is surrounded by an oval band inscribed 'Coolgardie Cycle Express Company'. The band is broken at the bottom by a straight label containing the value in words. Figures of value are in circles in the four angles and the words 'Western Australia' are at the sides. Lithographed in two colours on white wove paper, perforated.

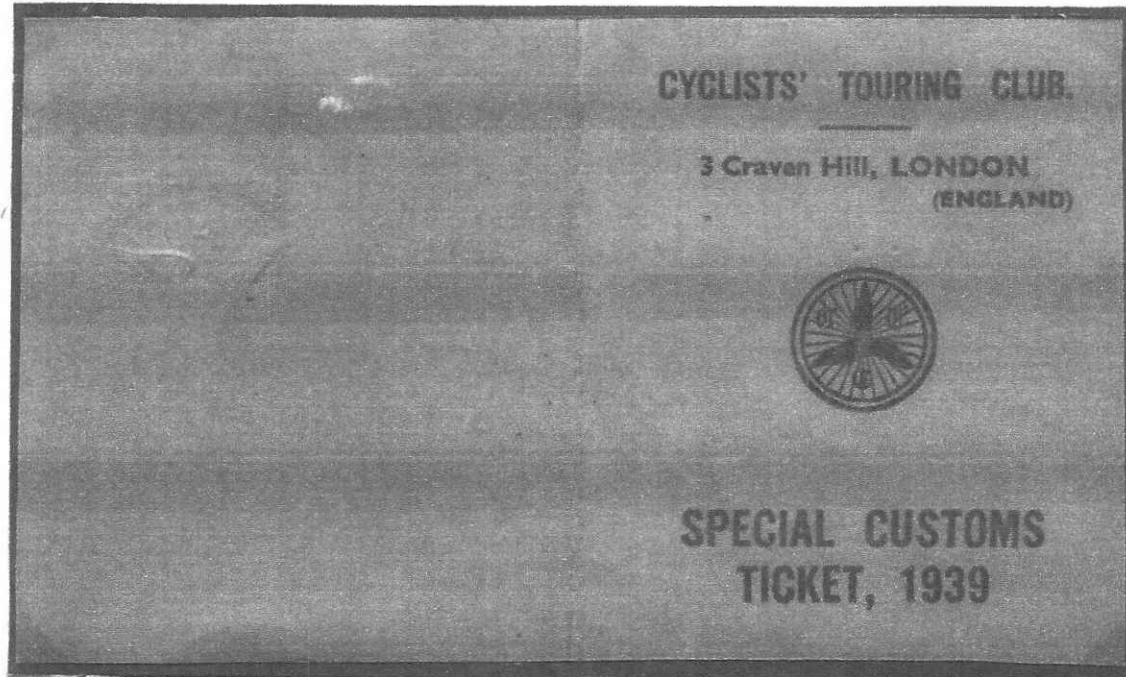


CYCLISTS' TOURING CLUB "SPECIAL CUSTOMS TICKET, 1939"

This is a card measuring 5 ¾ inches by 3 3/8th inches, folded at the centre, valid to 31 December 1939. The headings are in English, French and German. It was issued to L.G. Burr of 14 Defoe Avenue, Kew Surrey. The Machine is described as bicyclette Raleigh Frame number H85915. The Ticket was not valid in Italy. The corner of the photograph has been impressed with the logo of the C.T.C., which can be seen on the reverse side also.

I wrote recently to the Cyclists' Touring Club and was referred to the Modern Records Centre, University Library, at the University of Warwick, where the C.T.C. records are kept.

I assume that this ticket confirmed that Mr Burr was a member of the British National Touring Club during a difficult year in Europe but can anybody add further details?

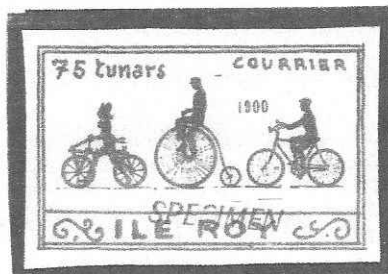

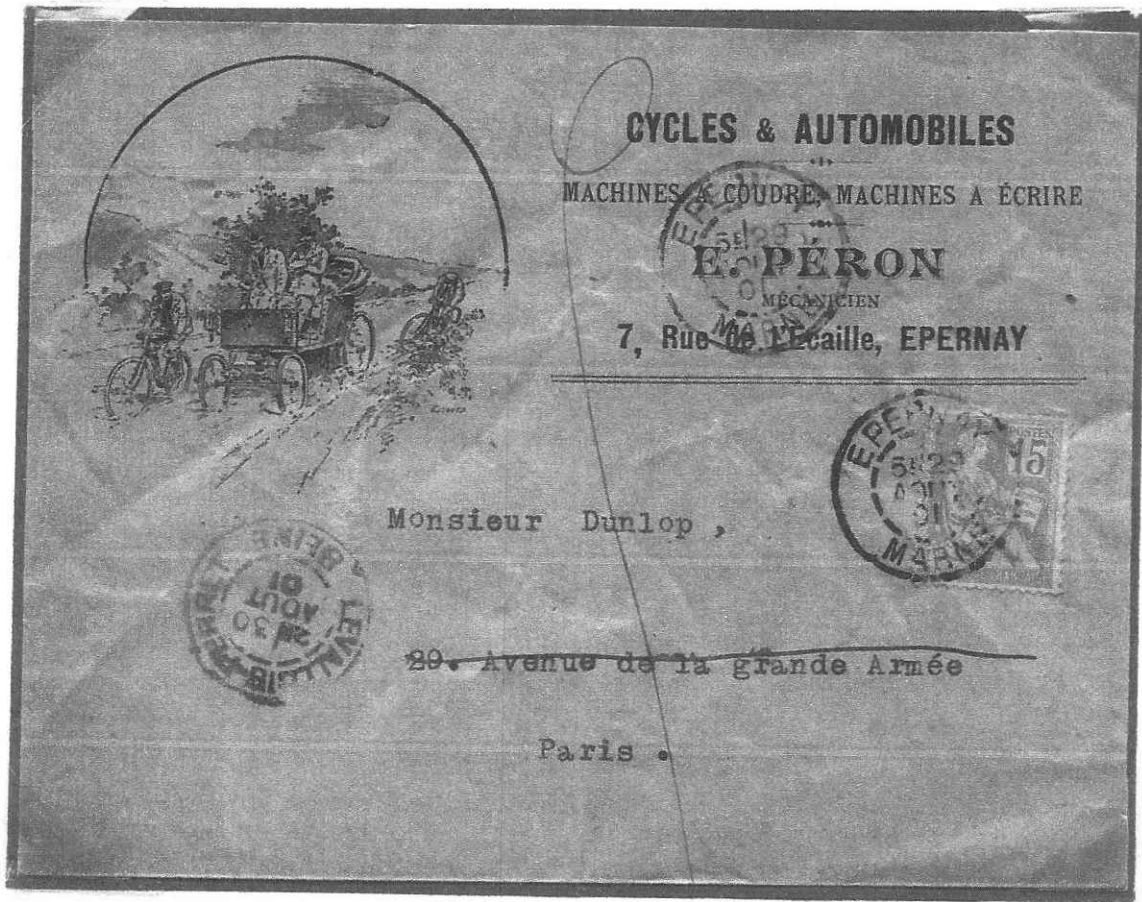

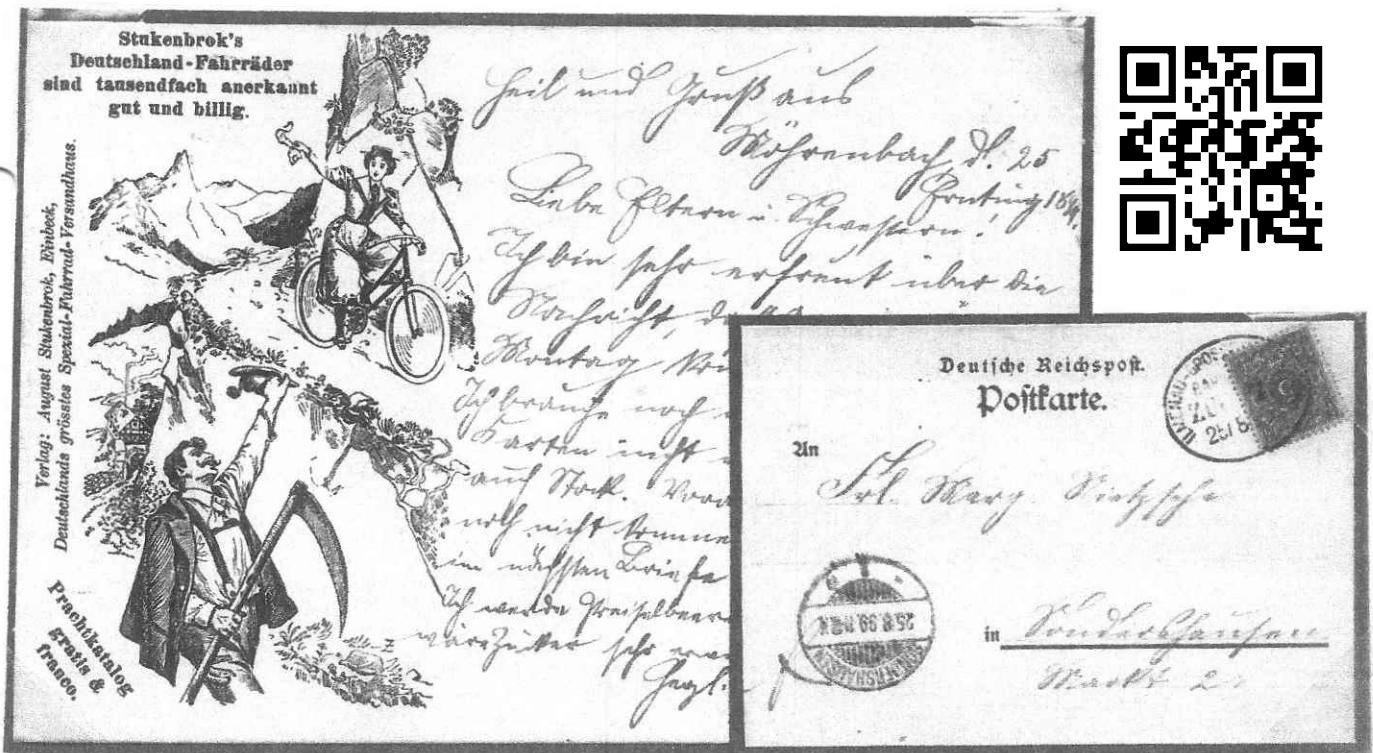

Regulations "MAMER 2017: Cycling & Philately"

1. The exhibition "MAMER 2017: Cycling & Philately" is for collections with emphasis on "cycling"
2. The responsible organizer is the Cercle Philatélique of the FSPL (Fédération des Sociétés Philatéliques du Grande-Duché de Luxembourg).
3. The exhibition takes place in Mamer/Luxembourg/Europe on Saturday 21st and Sunday 22nd October 2017.
4. To register the special entry form has to be sent, by 30th June 2017 directly to the exhibition director, Ralph LETSCH, 2 rue Spierzelt, L-8083 Bertrange.
5. The exhibitors will be selected by the organizers by 31st July. Each exhibitor has the right to a maximum of five frames of (12) or 15 sheets.
6. The collections will not be evaluated.
7. The collections should nevertheless not contain any items which are in contradiction to the regulations of the FIP on harmful or unwanted emissions.
8. Each exhibitor will receive a special prize as well as a diploma.
9. Only sheets which are to be exposed can be accepted. Each sheet must be provided with a transparent sleeve.
10. No entry fees will be charged.
11. The exhibitor must bring his collection to the exhibition. If requested, the organizer will mount it. The exhibitor is also obliged to demount the exhibit at the end of the exhibition. However, on request, the Organizer will dismount and arrange to deliver an exhibit to the exhibitor's home, on payment of EUR 30 in advance.
12. The exhibitor has to insure the collection himself. The organiser will provide the best possible protection of the collections but he declines all responsibilities concerning loss, damage and theft. This applies to the transit to and from the exhibition and whilst the exhibit is being mounted, the period that the exhibit is in the frames and whilst the exhibit is dismounted.
13. In all cases, which are not foreseen by the present regulation, the executive committee of the organisation will decide what action to take.
14. By signing the special entry form the exhibitor agrees to recognise and to observe these regulations.
